Captain Britta Steinbrenner, a 29-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, transferred to the County Services Bureau on October 11, 2015.

Captain Steinbrenner's career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1986. After graduating from the Sheriff's Training Academy as a Deputy Sheriff, she was assigned to Sybil Brand Institute for Women, Crescenta Valley / Altadena Stations, Sheriff's Headquarters Bureau and the International Liaison Unit. Upon her promotion to Sergeant in 1997, Captain Steinbrenner was assigned to Crescenta Valley Station, Santa Clarita Valley Station, Risk Management Bureau and Emergency Operations Bureau as the Homeland Security Division Chief's Aide. After being promoted to

Lieutenant in 2006, Captain Steinbrenner was assigned to the Court Services Central and West Bureaus, West Hollywood Station, Reserve Forces Bureau, Emergency Operations Bureau and Personnel Administration. As a Captain she was assigned to the Sheriff's Information Bureau, and later helped establish the Community Partnerships Bureau which allowed all of the Department's community based policing and customer service based units to be placed under one command.

Captain Steinbrenner, holds an Associates of Arts Degree from Santa Monica City College. She received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business Administration/Management from the University of La Verne in March 2015 and is continuing with her Master's Program in Organizational Management also with the University of La Verne. She speaks German and is the Department's German Language Proficiency examiner.
