

Captain Jeffrey W. Perry

Jeffrey Perry is a 26-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. He was promoted to the rank of Captain by Sheriff Lee Baca and assigned to Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Bureau). The mission of COPS Bureau is to provide a holistic approach to problem-oriented policing by developing, maintaining, and coordinating a multitude of assets to proactively reduce violent crime and enhance the quality of life for residents throughout Los Angeles County.

Captain Perry's career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1988. After working for a short time as a Community Service Officer, he graduated from the Sheriff's Training Academy as a Deputy Sheriff. As a Deputy, he was first assigned to the Men's Central Jail and worked patrol at Lynwood and Century Stations. He transferred to the Countywide Community Policing Team in 2003 and worked all areas of Los Angeles County in this assignment. Captain Perry promoted to sergeant and was assigned to Century Station and Emergency Operations Bureau, specializing in tactical planning and counter-terrorism. After being promoted to Lieutenant in 2009, Captain Perry was assigned to Century Station and the Office of the Assistant Sheriff.
