

Captain Joseph B. Nunez

Joseph B. Nuñez, a 34-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, was promoted to Captain by Sheriff Lee Baca in October 2011. As captain, he has held assignments at Internal Affairs Bureau, Transportation Bureau, Century Regional Detention Facility, Custody Headquarters-Special Projects and Crime Information Management Bureau.

Captain Nuñez's career with the Department began in 1981 as a pre-academy employee assigned to Biscailuz Center. He attended the Department's Training Academy as a member of Class #206. After graduating as a Deputy Sheriff, he held assignments at Biscailuz Center, Temple Station, Narcotics Bureau, Recruit Training Bureau, and the Advanced Officer Training Unit. In 1996, he was promoted to Sergeant and assigned to Norwalk Station, Pico Rivera Station, Walnut/San Dimas Regional Station, and Century Station. In 2000, he was promoted to Lieutenant and assigned to Pico Rivera Station, Court Services West Bureau, Court Services East Bureau, Narcotics Bureau, and Pico Rivera Station (Operations).

He is a graduate of the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy, Class #224, and the Drug Enforcement Administration, Drug Unit Commander Academy, Class #69.
