CAPTAIN EDDIE RIVERO



Captain Eddie Rivero's career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1990 when he attended the Department's Training Academy. After graduating as a Deputy Sheriff, he was assigned to Men's Central Jail, Carson Station, and the Training Bureau, Advanced Officer Training Unit. While assigned to the Training Bureau, he trained Department personnel in patrol tactics and hate crimes, quickly becoming a subject-matter expert in these fields. He was certified as a hate crimes instructor through the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center and served as a co-facilitator at the Simon Wiesenthal Museum of Tolerance.

Captain Rivero promoted to sergeant in 2000, and was assigned to Norwalk Station, the Bureau of Compliance, where he founded the Respect-Based Leadership Program, and Correctional Services Division Headquarters where he served as the Chief's Aide. He promoted to Lieutenant in 2006, and was assigned to Court Services Division and Carson Station.

In April 2011, Captain Rivero was appointed as the Unit Commander of Carson Station until he was promoted to Captain in April 2012, and served as the Captain of Carson Station

In June 2014, Captain Rivero was assigned to Operation Safe Streets Bureau.

Captain Rivero holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Ecology from the University of California, Irvine, and a Master of Public Administration Degree from the University of La Verne. In addition, he taught classes in Political Science, Criminal Justice, and Liberal Studies as an Adjunct Professor at a local university.
