



Alfred M. Reyes, Captain Walnut/Diamond Bar Station

Captain Al Reyes is a 32 year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. He took command of the Walnut/Diamond Bar Sheriff's Station on October 2, 2016.

Captain Reyes' career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1984. After graduating from the Sheriff's Academy as a deputy sheriff, he was assigned to the Hall of Justice Jail, East Los Angeles and Norwalk Sheriff's Stations. During his tenure as a patrol deputy, he worked as a field training officer and as a member of a Community Oriented Problem Solving Team, which worked in partnership with the community to fight and prevent crime. In 2000, Captain Reyes was promoted to the rank of sergeant and supervised patrol functions at both Century and Lennox Sheriff's Stations. He later transferred to Norwalk Sheriff's Station where he worked as an Operations Sergeant. Upon his promotion to Lieutenant in 2007, he remained at Norwalk Sheriff's Station where he served as the Service Area Lieutenant for the unincorporated areas of South and West Whittier. He also served as the Operations Lieutenant for Norwalk and Walnut/Diamond Bar Sheriff's Stations. In 2015, Captain Reyes was assigned to Sheriff's Headquarters where he served as the executive aide to the Chief of East Patrol Division.

Captain Reyes has an Associate in Arts degree in liberal arts from Mount San Antonio College, and he is working toward a Bachelor of Science degree in leadership from Trident University International.

Captain Reyes firmly believes in maintaining strong partnerships with the communities he serves to reduce and prevent crime, and to improve their quality of life.
