



EDDIE RIVERO, CAPTAIN LOS ANGELES COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT CARSON STATION

On April 1, 2012, Eddie Rivero, a 24-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, was promoted to Captain and placed in command of Carson Sheriff's Station.

Captain Rivero's career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1990 when he attended the Department's Training Academy. After graduating as a deputy sheriff, he held assignments at Men's Central Jail, Carson Station, and the Advanced Officer Training Unit.

Eddie was promoted to sergeant in 2000, where he worked at Norwalk Station as a field sergeant and watch commander; at the Bureau of Compliance, where he founded the Respect-Based Leadership Training Program; and at Correctional Services Division Headquarters where he served as the Chief's Aide. In 2006, he was promoted to lieutenant and assigned to Court Services Division as the district lieutenant, where he was responsible for more than 150 sworn and professional staff, and oversaw a 17 million dollar annual budget. In 2007, he was assigned to Carson Station where he worked as a watch commander and then as the operations lieutenant, where he maintained responsibility for the day-to-day operations of the station. In April 2011, he was appointed to the position of Acting Captain until his final appointment as the Unit Commander, where he continues to proudly work alongside 200 plus personnel providing police services to more than 120,000 residents.

Eddie holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Ecology from the University of California Irvine, as well as a Master of Public Administration Degree from the University of La Verne. In addition, for six years, he taught classes in Political Science, Criminal Justice, and Liberal Studies as an adjunct professor at California Baptist University.
