Sergio Aloma, a 30-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, was promoted to the rank of Captain by Sheriff Jim McDonnell on April 2, 2017. He is assigned to the West Hollywood Sheriff's station which serves the city of West Hollywood and Universal City Walk.

Captain Aloma's career with the Sheriff's Department began in September 1987 as an off-the-streeter.
