As summer months heat up, so do tempers. Many assaults, especially those involving domestic violence, are the result of individuals who lose control of their anger. Here are some indicators to look for which may be indicative of pending abusive behaviors, including assaults:

- Threats of violence
- Breaking or striking objects
- Use of force in sex
- Possessiveness and lack of trust
- Verbal abuse
- Jealousy
- Name calling and put-downs
- Unrealistic expectations
- Transference of blame for problems
- Physical force towards you or others
- Cruelty to animals and/or children
