INJURY & HEALTH SUPPORT SERVICES

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Provide assistance and advice to administrators regarding Worker's Compensation and return to work efforts.

Conduct training for executives, managers, first line supervisors, operations staff, and new employees.

Respond to assist employees who are seriously ill or injured to facilitate coordination of benefits 24 hours a day.

Provide assistance to families in the event of serious injury, illness, or death of an employee.

Facilitate an employee's return to work after being injured.

Coordinate Department response and resources for employee memorial services.

Liaison with York Risk Services Group, our third party administrator.

Coordinate the Fitness for Duty Re-evaluation (Psych and Medical).

DEPARTMENT TRAINING

Worker's Compensation and return to work efforts are ever changing and very complex. It is essential that training be provided to employees, first line supervisors, operations staff, and management personnel.

Specific training modules can be developed by the Injury & Health Support Unit to meet the specific needs of each unit within the Department.

INDUSTRIAL INJURIES

An industrial injury is an injury, illness, or disease which occurs as a result of an employee's employment with the County.

It is the employee's responsibility to immediately report the circumstances of an injury or illness to a supervisor. If the problem is not emergent, the employee shall notify his/her supervisor prior to seeking medical attention.

Supervisors must document and report all work related injuries. Only the third party administrator can deny a claim. Supervisors shall provide a claim form (DWC-1) to the employee within 24 hours and accompany the employee to the initial medical visit to discuss the availability of modified duties with the physician. Corvel (1-888-419-0585) must be notified as soon as possible.

An Injury & Health Support Unit representative can be requested for an emergent response 24 hours a day through Sheriff's Information Bureau 213-229-1700.

DEPARTMENT TRAINING

Certain injuries are presumed to be industrial injuries for peace officers. These conditionally presumptive medical conditions are:

-Hernia	-Pneumonia
-Tuberculosis	-Certain types of Cancer
-Heart conditions	-Lower back injuries

Although these injuries are presumptive and believed to be related to the duties of a peace officer, these ailments must be medically determined to have been caused by or related to the duties of a peace officer. In all cases, the determination will be made by the third party administrator and their review process.

DEPARTMENT TRAINING

Non-industrial injuries are those injuries that occur as a result of non-work related activities.

Each incident is unique and the Injury & Health Support Unit can provide the necessary expertise to aid the unit and the employee in finding the most equitable solution possible.

DEPARTMENT TRAINING

Regardless of the cause or type of injury or illness, all supervisors must engage the employee in a good faith interactive process meeting to determine if the employee is in need of an accommodation.

The meeting must be documented and a copy placed in the employee's medical file. A reporting template is available through the Injury & Health Support Unit. If an accommodation is required, contact the Injury & Health Support Unit for assistance.
