Following a major disaster, police, fire and medical professionals may not be able to fully meet the demand. <u>People will have to rely on each other</u> to meet the immediate life saving and life sustaining needs, *particularly* in isolated neighborhoods that may be cut off from the main roads for a period of time.

The County of Los Angeles Fire Department **Community Emergency Response Training (CERT)** program was developed through FEMA to provide basic training in safety and life saving skills for the general public.

The course curriculum covers the following modules:

- Emergency Preparedness
- Fire Safety
- Emergency Medical Operations-One victim
- Emergency Medical Operations-Triage
- Light Search and Rescue Operations

- CERT Organization
- Disaster Psychology
- Terrorism
- Course Review
- Disaster Simulation Exercise

The training course will be presented as a series of <u>three classes</u> on August 26, August 27 and August 28, 2013

from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM

You must attend all three sessions to get your certificate of completion.
