

How do we do it?

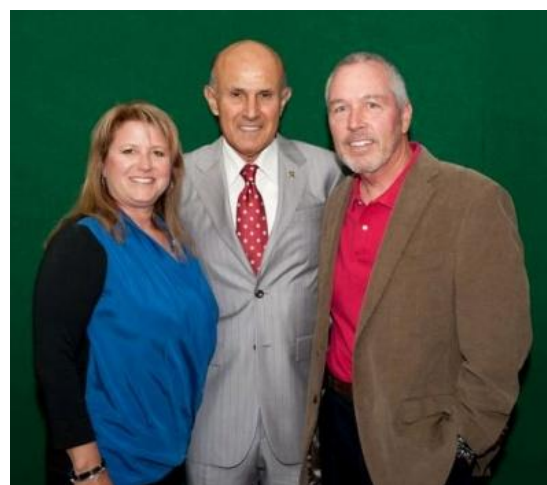
The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department San Dimas Station provides law enforcement services to the City of San Dimas, as well as the unincorporated areas of Azusa, Claremont, Covina, Glendora, La Verne and Pomona, as well as the mountain areas of Los Angeles County near Mt. Baldy Village, Glendora, Azusa, Highway 39, Crystal Lake, and the Angeles National Forest. We serve 105,000 residents in an area encompassing 276 square miles.

How do we do it? Not alone! We are extremely fortunate to have over 100 volunteers who assist and support us and the community in our public safety mission. Twenty Reserve Deputies, 34 Volunteers on Patrol, 11 Sheriff's Explorers, 28 Mountain Rescue mountaineers, 20 Posse members, clerical staff, and dozens of other volunteers commit thousands of hours annually to assist our operations and make our communities safe. The volunteers individually dedicate their own time throughout the year, many times performing the same functions as full-time (paid!) personnel. These volunteers tirelessly and selflessly give their time, day in and day out, all year long to help the residents of the San Dimas Station area.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department was pleased to honor these dedicated volunteers, particularly several who have dedicated a significant part of their lives serving the residents of the San Dimas Station area. While every one of our volunteers makes an impact with their time and effort, each year several are recognized for their cumulative effort and consistent dedication.

San Dimas Station personnel and Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department officials began their recognition of local volunteers this year by participating in the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's annual Pinning Ceremony at the headquarters of the Association of Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriffs (ALADS) in Monterey Park. The nationwide theme this year, "Volunteers, Spark of Light," was very evident at the event as Sheriff Lee Baca recognized Sheriff's Department volunteers from throughout Los Angeles County. Of the more than 3,200 volunteers that serve the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, over 100 of them base their volunteer efforts right here in San Dimas.

San Dimas resident **Lisa Fosselman** was honored at the 2013 ceremony for her long time efforts as a Sheriff's Posse member and Volunteer. Lisa is the wife of retired Sheriff's Lieutenant (and current Reserve Deputy) **Pete Fosselman**. She has volunteered over 1,000 hours to the San Dimas
