Deputy Lorraine Marino joined the team in 1999. She worked at the Twin Towers Correctional Facility for 7 years, 5 of them as a training officer. Deputy Marino came to the Walnut station in 2006. She worked in the field and on special teams until about 2010 when she became a field training officer. She has been a training officer at the station for about 7 years, training about 3 to 4 trainees a year. Last year Deputy Marino arrested 38 Felonies and 168 misdemeanors. This year she has arrested 19 felonies and 88 misdemeanors. Deputy Marino has been with her husband for 13 years and have been married for 7. She has a 6 year old son (Hunter) and a 2 year old daughter (Scarlett). In her spare time she likes to volunteer at her son's school and do things together as a family. She enjoys hiking and riding rollercoasters together.
